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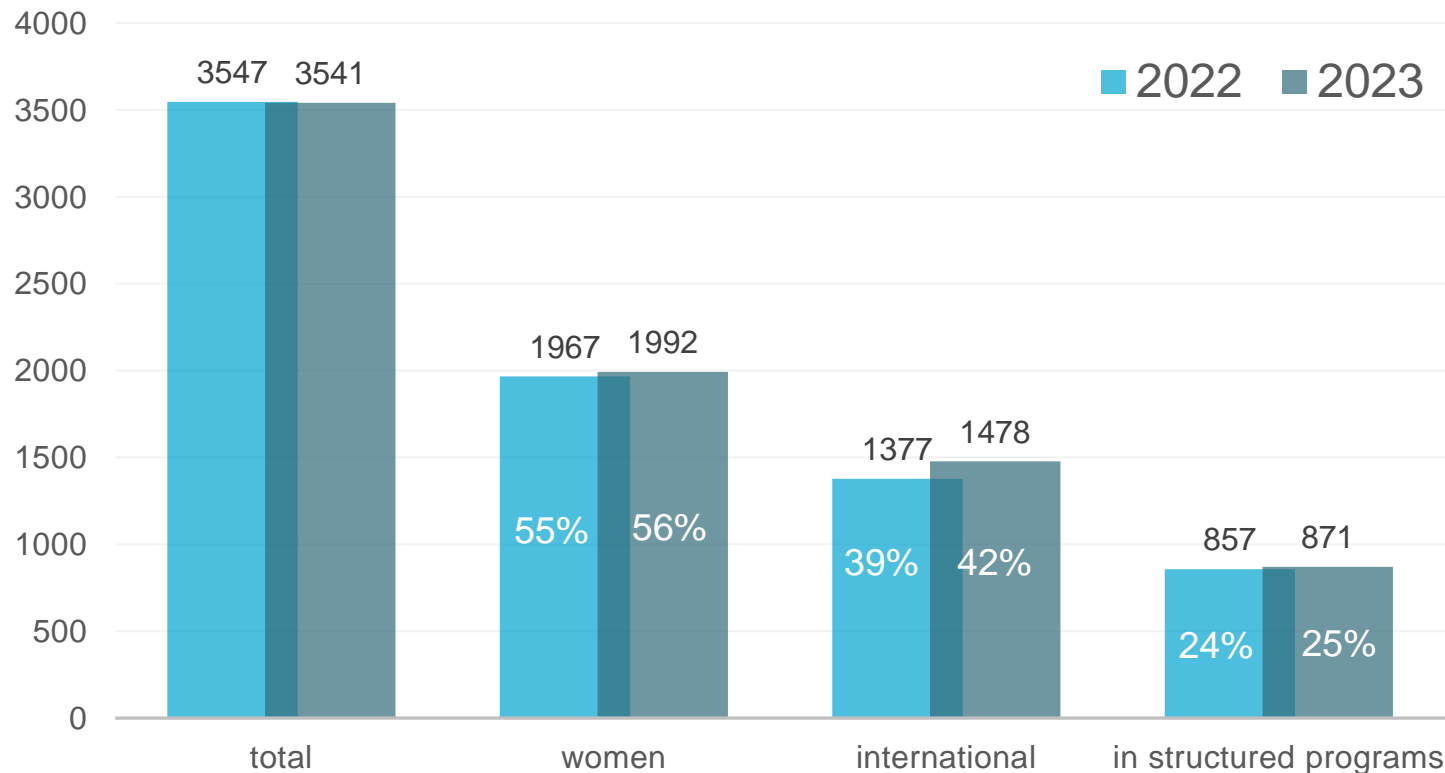

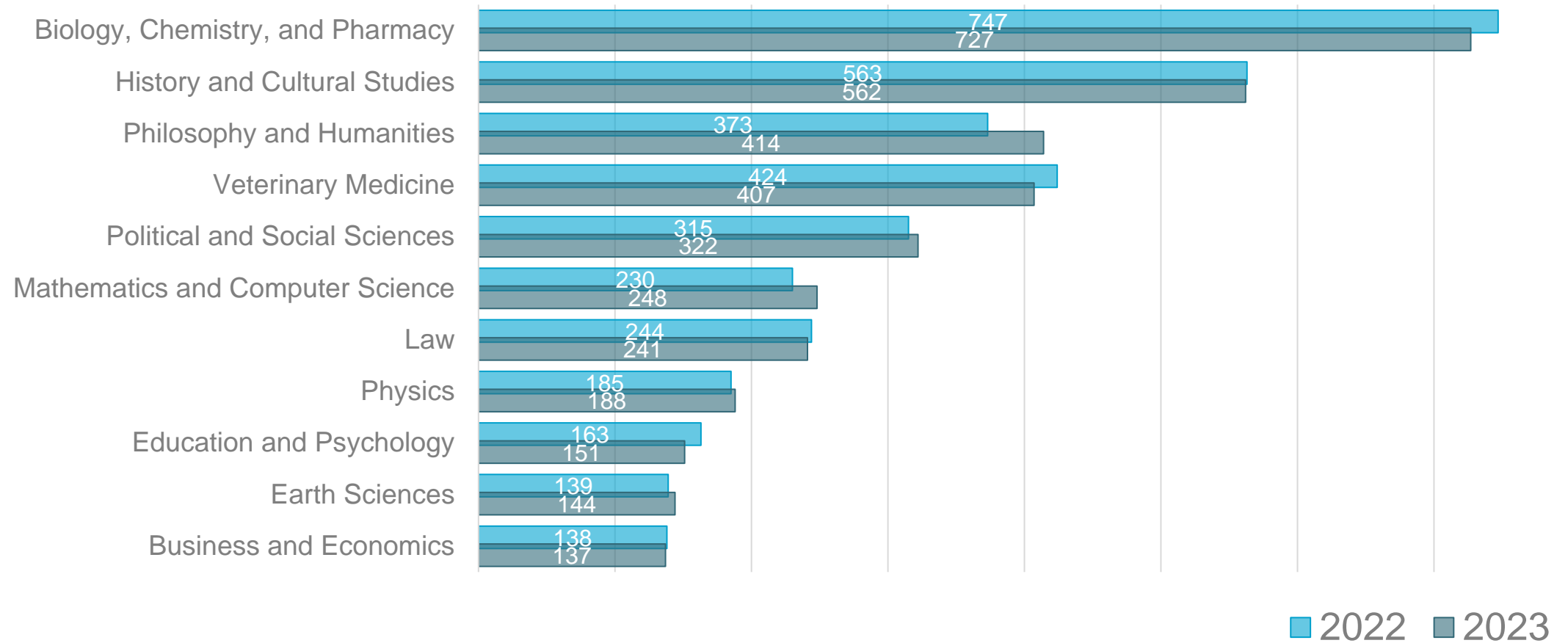
Enrolled doctoral researchers



University enrollment statistics as of December 1, 2022 and 2023. Under the Berlin Higher Education Act, doctoral researchers not employed by the university must enroll as doctoral students to gain access to necessary resources and recognition. Employed researchers are exempt. As a result, not all employed doctoral researchers are included in the university statistics.

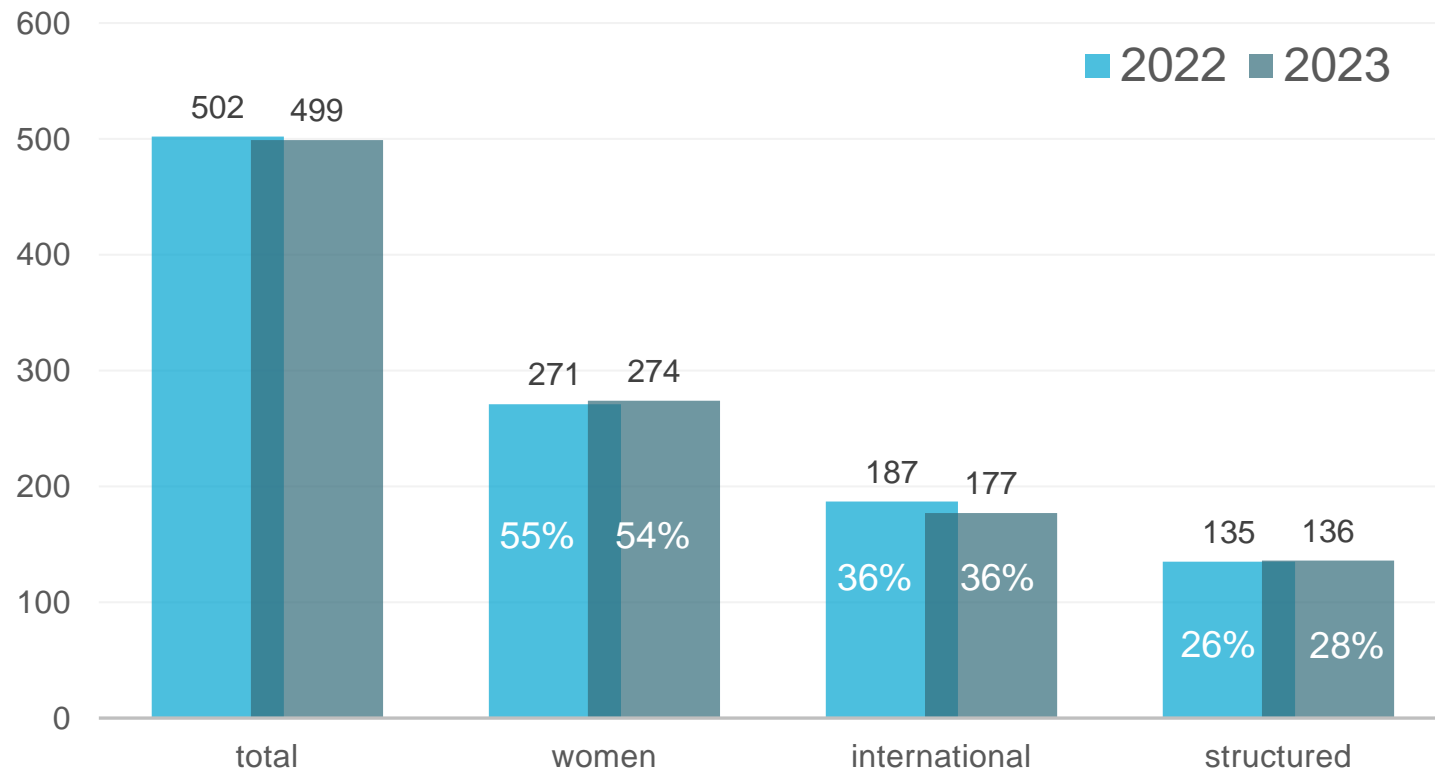

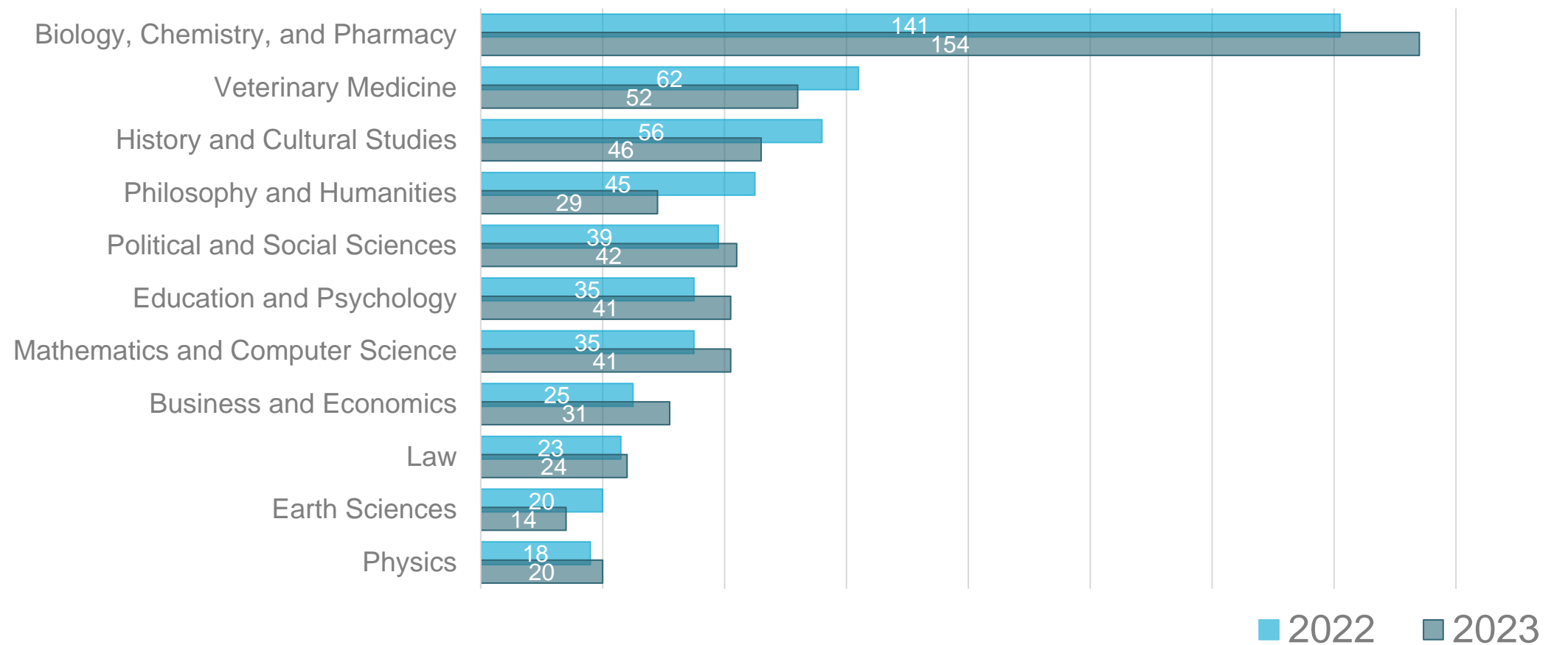


University exam statistics by academic year:

The academic year 2022 comprises winter semester 2021/22 and summer semester 2022, the academic year 2023 winter semester 2022/23 and summer semester 2023.

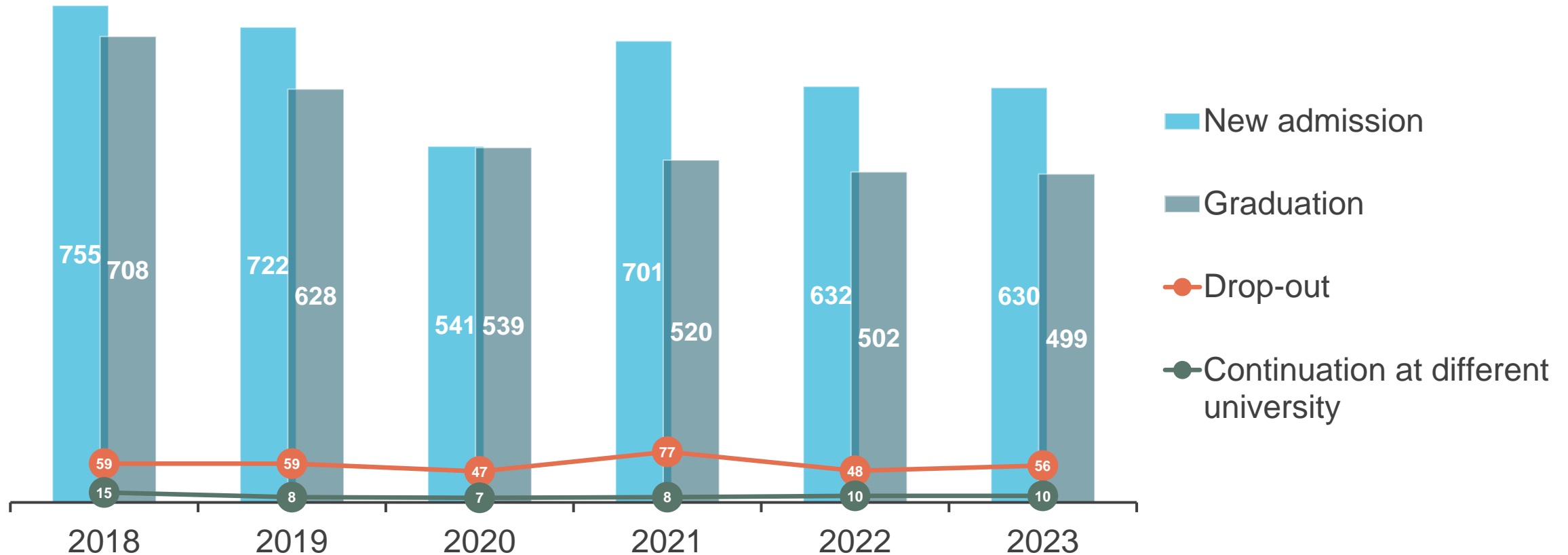

The new DRS is the result of extensive discussions with various university stakeholders and will serve all doctoral researchers at the university.

Dahlem Research School

- links doctoral committees, offices, programs, and graduate centers with the university executive board.

- supports departments in the monitoring of cooperative doctorates.
- provides a secure scientific environment for all doctoral researchers at Freie Universität Berlin.
- promotes good doctoral supervision, structured programs, and supports all doctoral researchers with interdisciplinary qualifications and advice in non-academic matters.

- all departments and central research institutes of Freie Universität Berlin,
- all DRS-accredited doctoral programs,
- the Doctoral Council (still to be established).

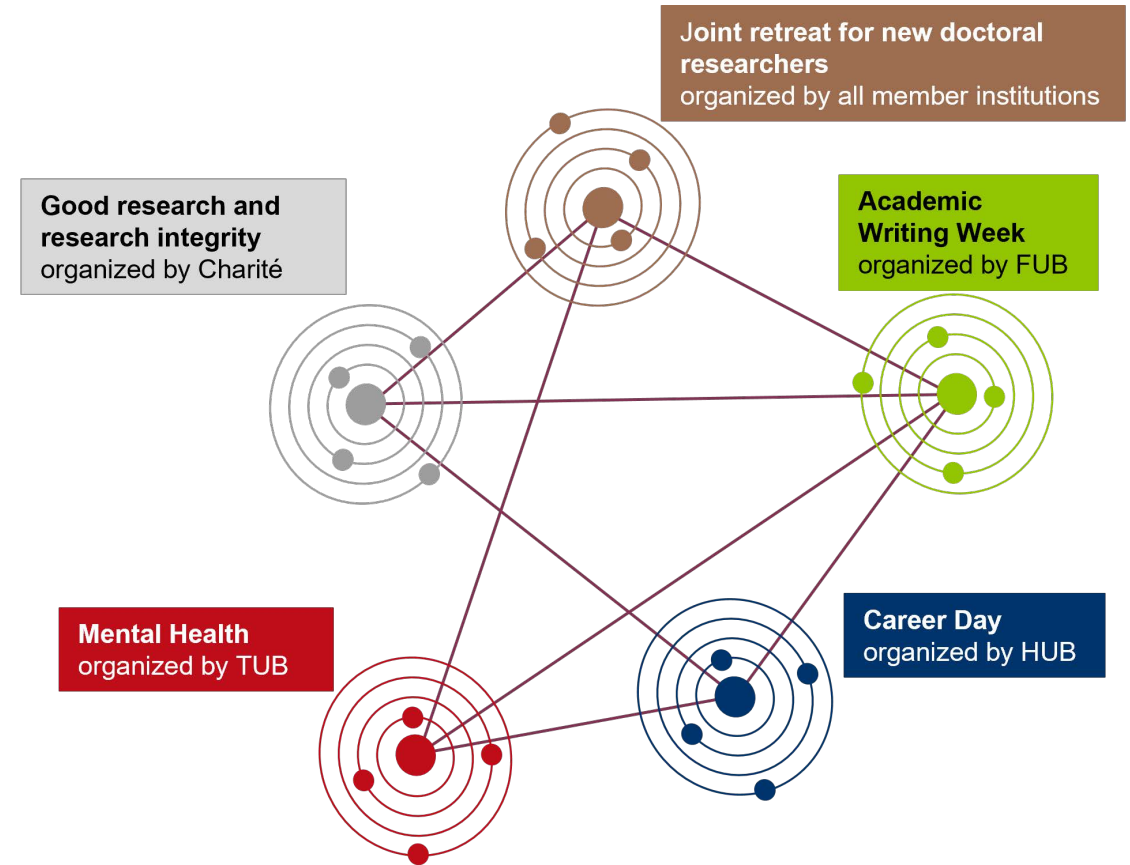
QUALIFICATION

Additionally, Dahlem Research School's exclusive events are open to all doctoral researchers from BUA partner institutions.

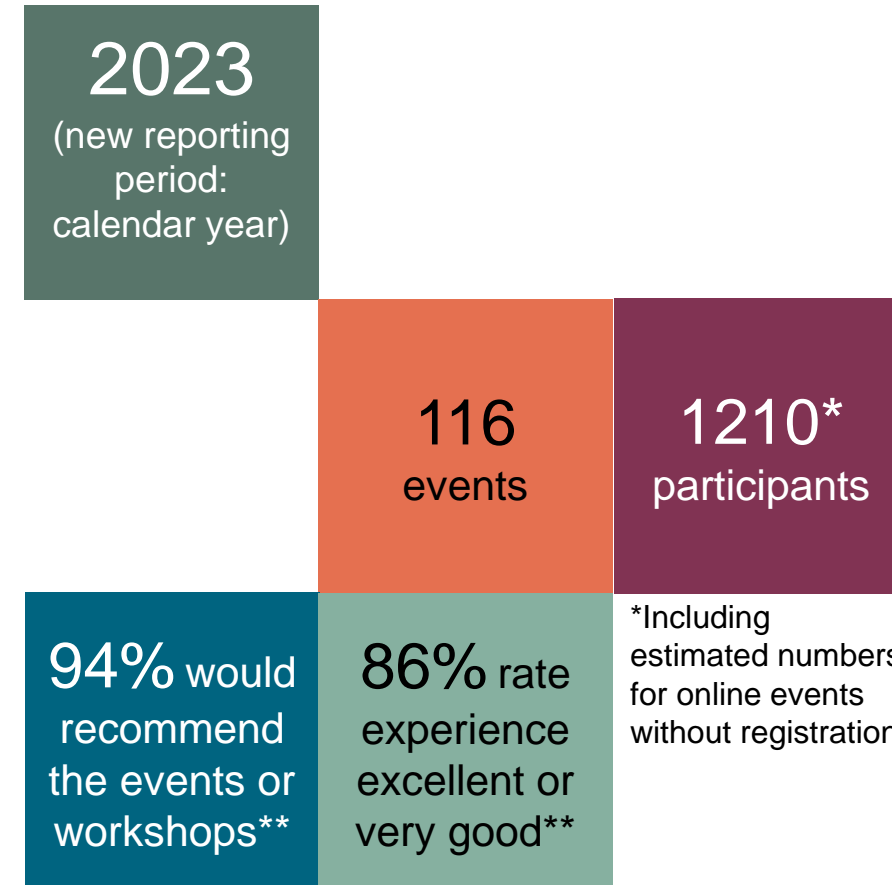
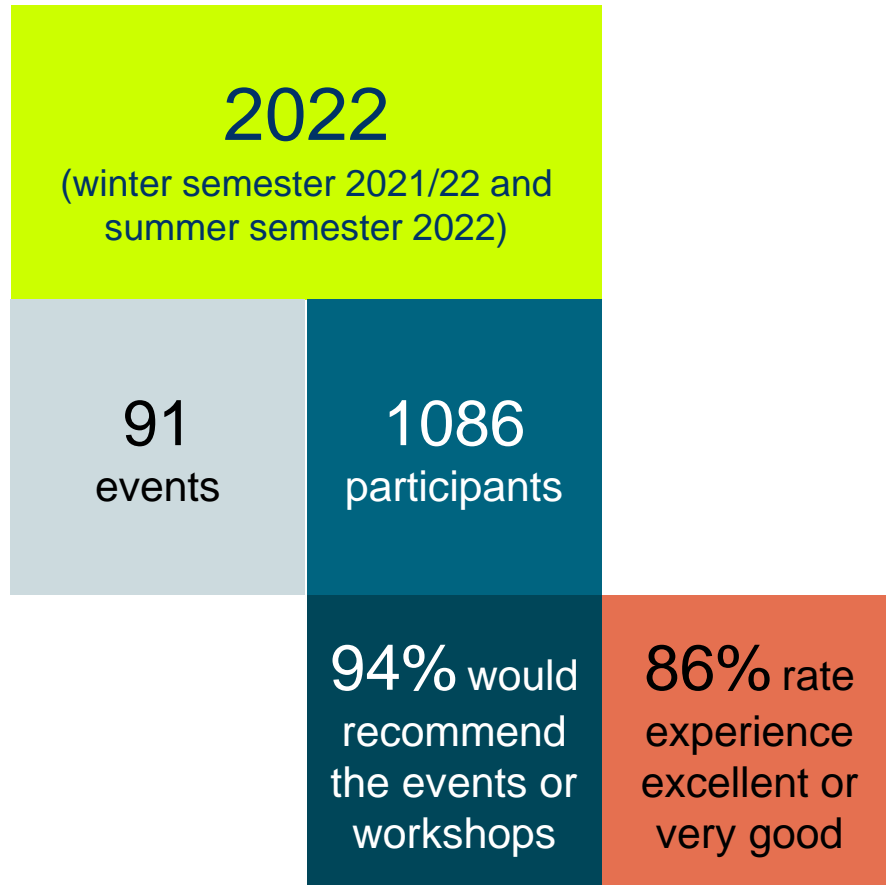
This structure aims to provide a well-rounded and collaborative academic experience for participants.

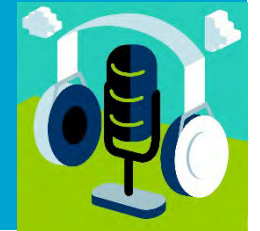

Doctoral Programs of Dahlem Research School

According to data surveys carried out by Dahlem Research School, in December 2022, 924 and in December 2023, 950 doctoral researchers at Freie Universität Berlin are part of Dahlem Research School's 27 doctoral degree programs (excluding those registered at partner universities).

The total number of programs, including 21 sub-programs, is 48.

Data comparison with the enrollment statistics (see slide 4: 857 and 871 doctoral researchers) shows that 7% to 8% of DRS doctoral researchers are not enrolled.

We estimate that approximately 4,000 researchers are pursuing their doctorate at Freie Universität Berlin, including those not enrolled. However, we have to rely on the university's enrollment statistics as the only standardized source of information.

According to these, 3,547 and 3,541 researchers were pursuing their doctorate on December 1, 2022 and 2023, respectively (see slide 4: Employed researchers are exempt from the requirement to enroll as doctoral students).

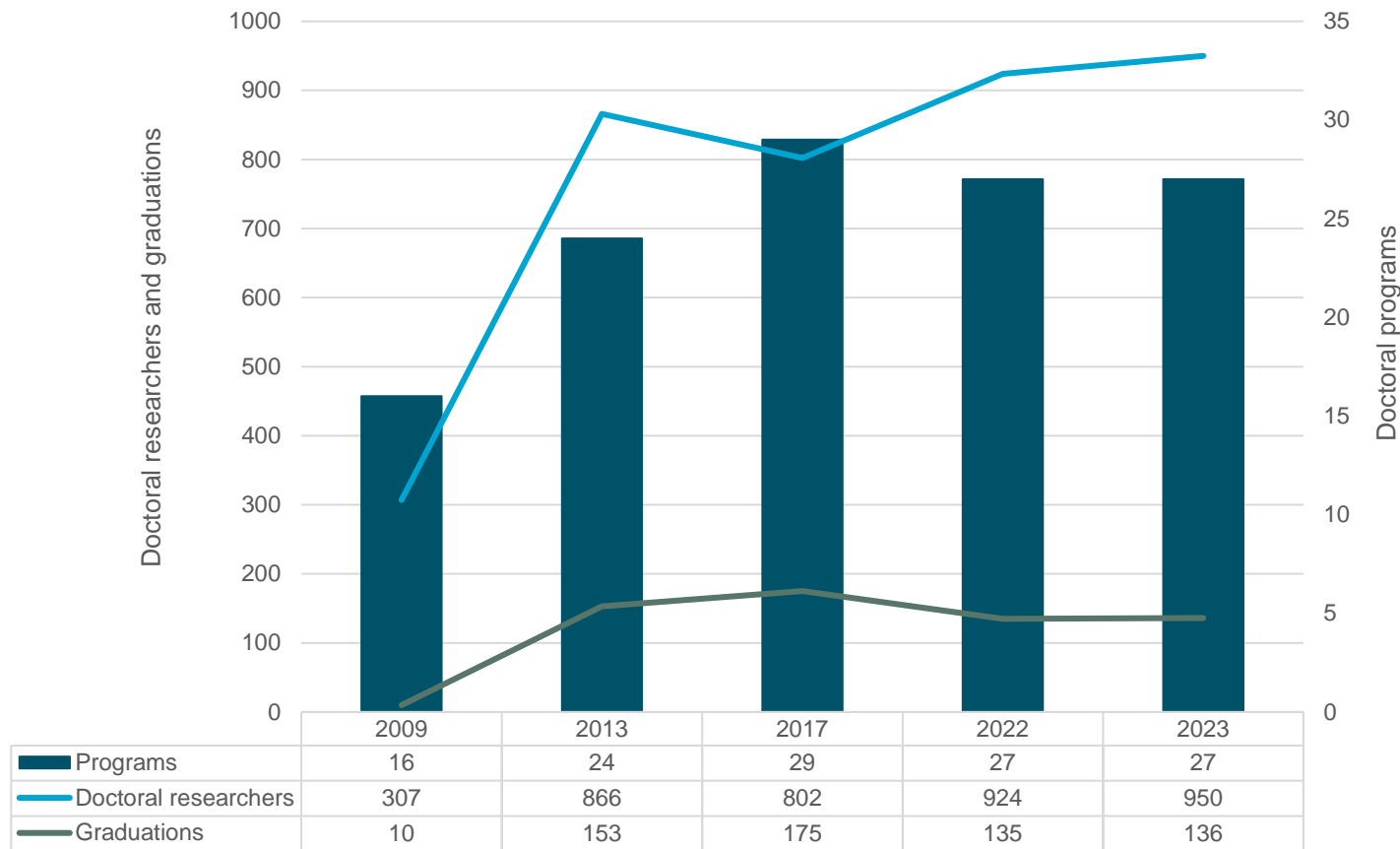

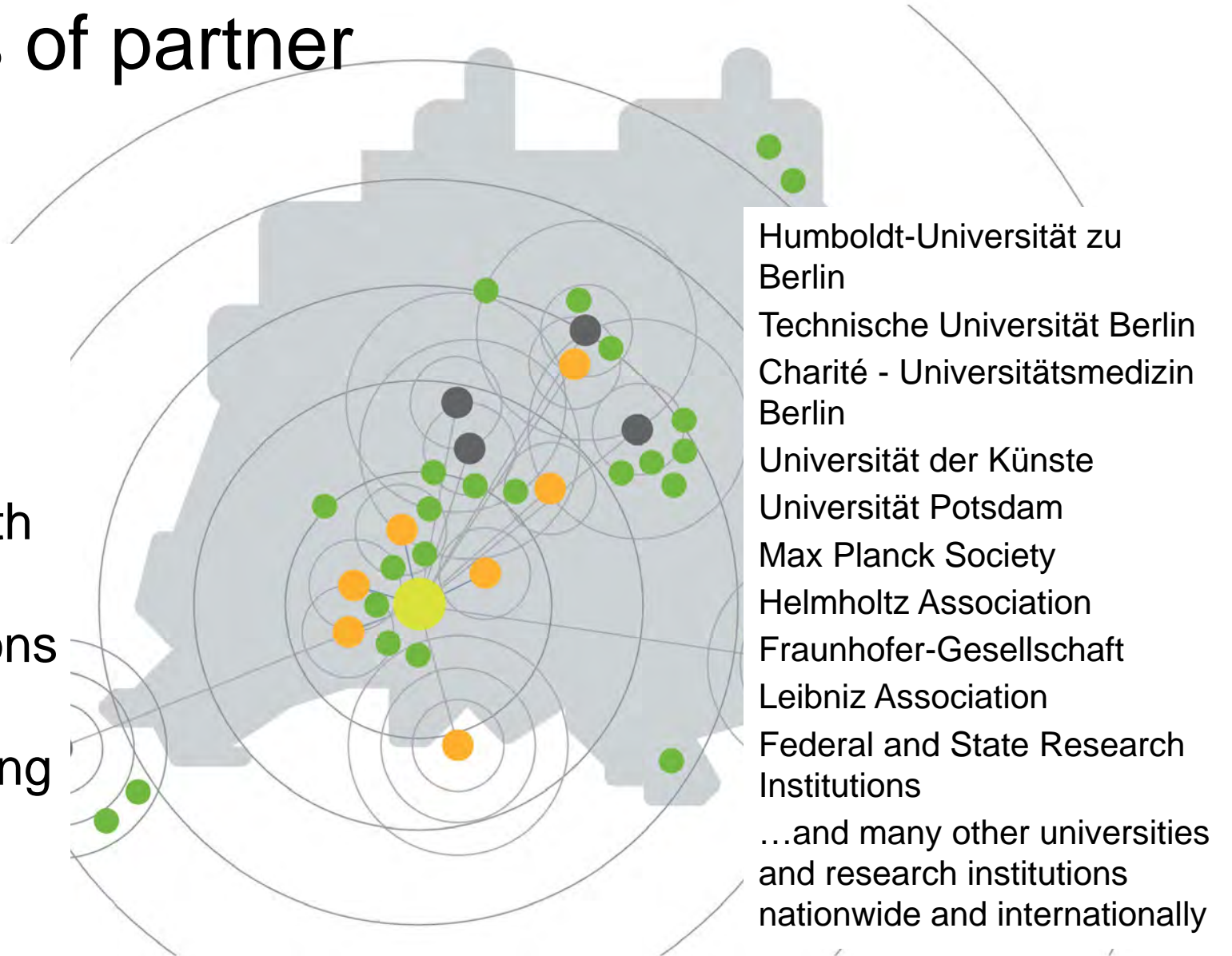

Regional networks of partner institutions

Berlin's universities and the University of Potsdam host over 100 graduate schools and doctoral programs. Researchers collaborate with other universities and non-university research institutions in Berlin and Brandenburg, creating a rich and stimulating research environment.



Recruitment and Admission

Calls for member program applications are globally promoted via online academic platforms, research career fairs, and Freie Universität's liaison offices.

These offices advertise regionally, provide higher education information and advice, and screen potential applicants.

In **2022**, 118 new doctoral researchers were admitted to DRS programs.

50% of these are female.

59% are international.

In **2023**, 127 new doctoral researchers were admitted to DRS programs.

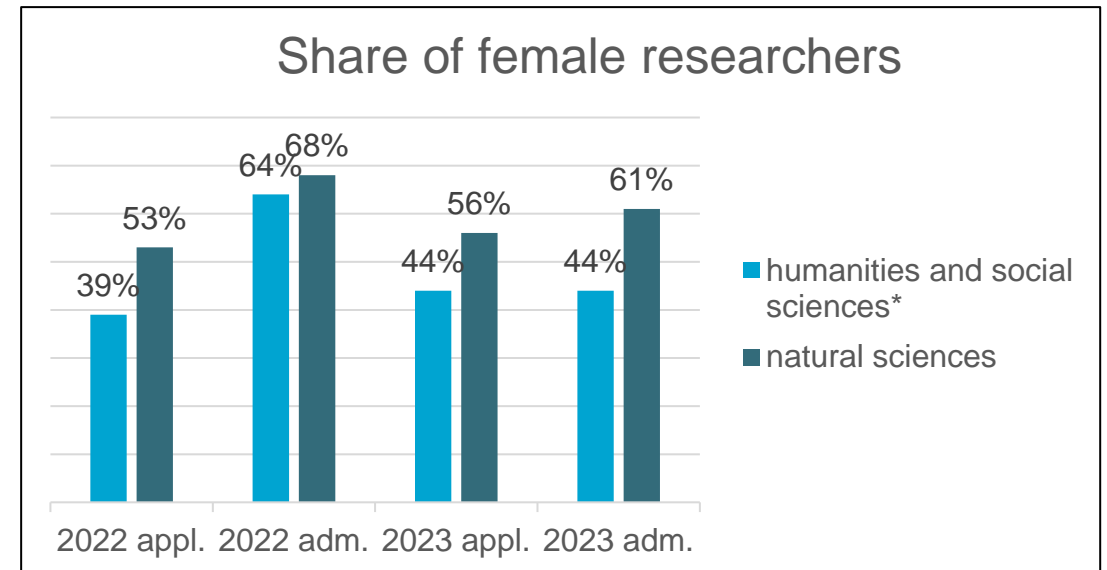

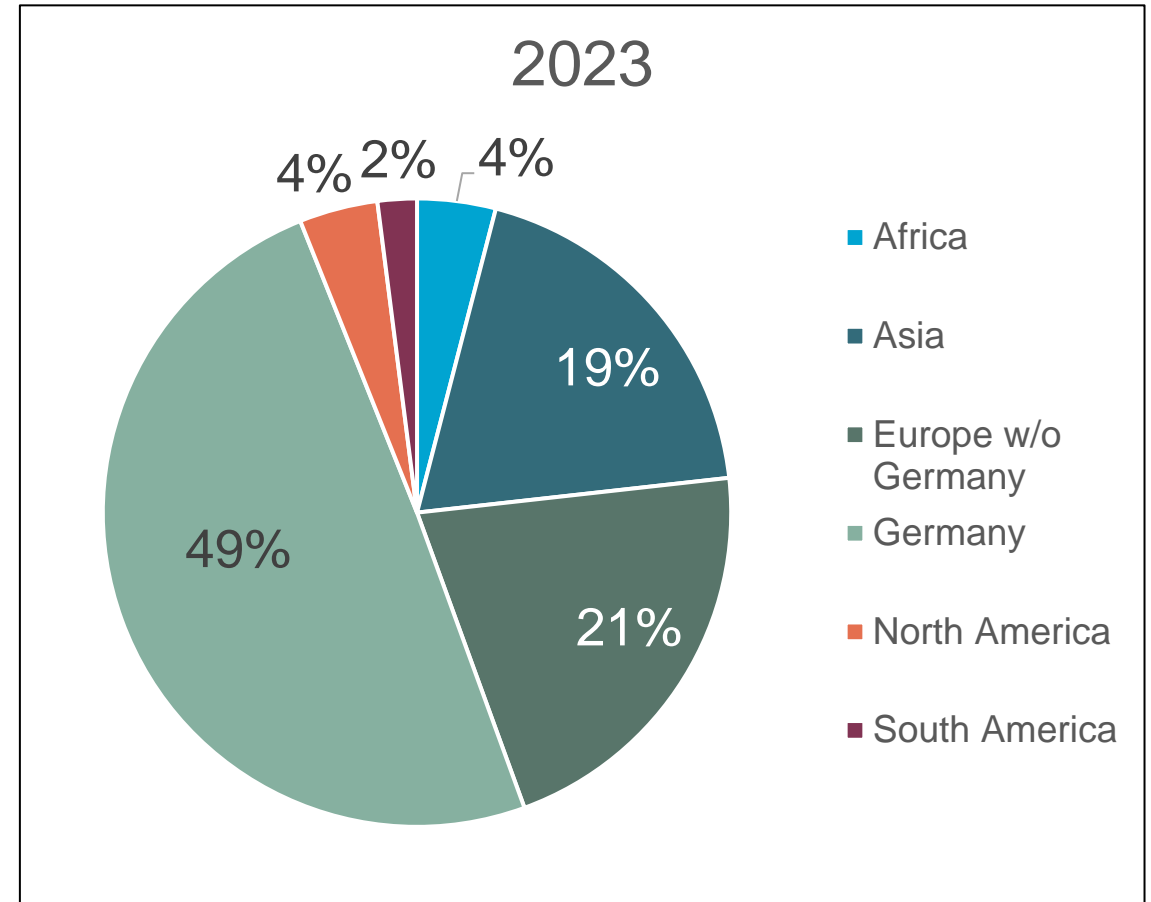
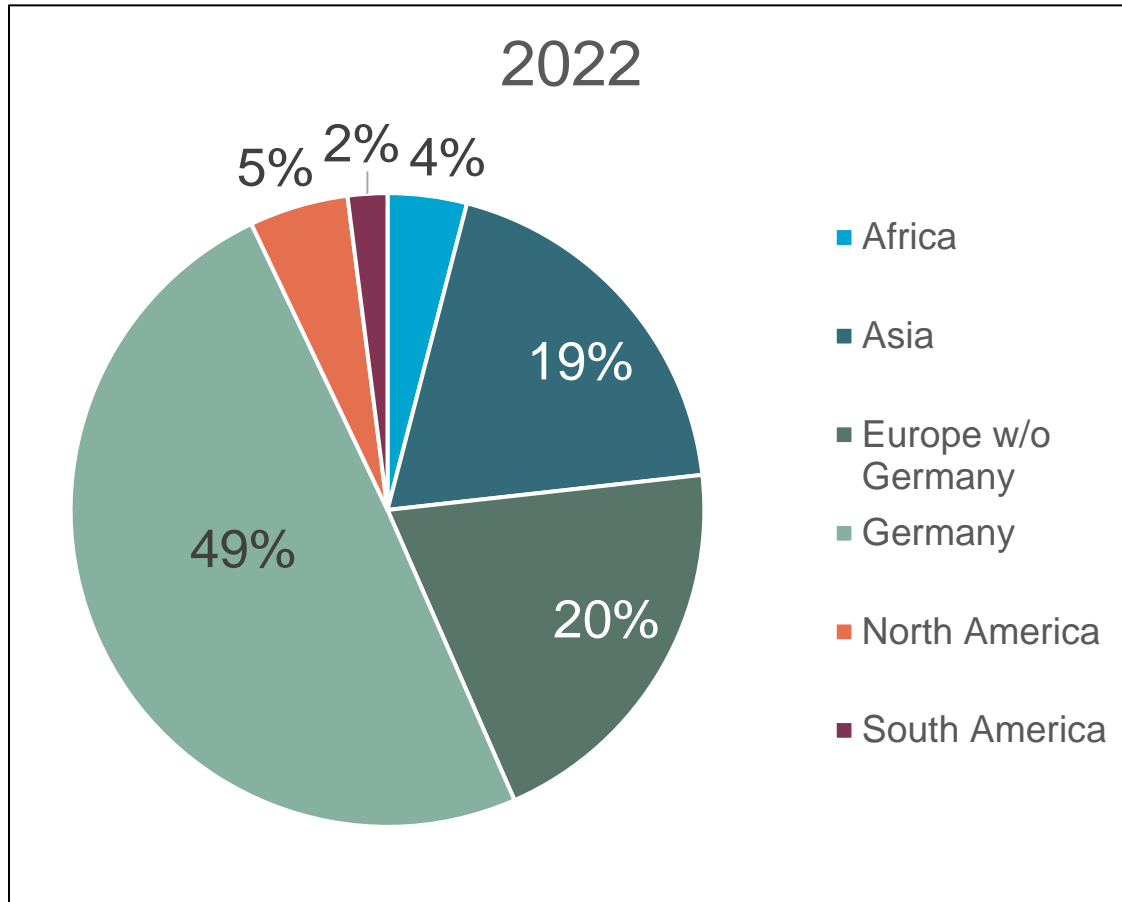

12 DRS Programs use the **DRS application platform** to recruit doctoral researchers.

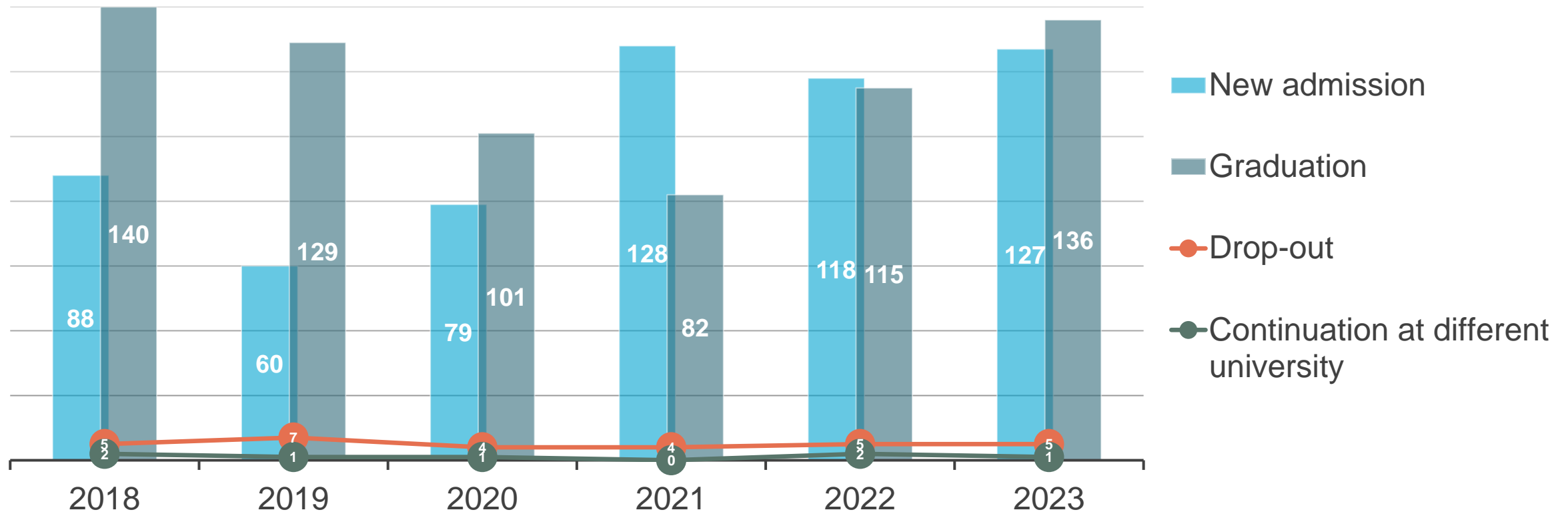
In 2022, 82% of applicants and 56% of admissions were international. In 2023, these figures rose to 85% of applicants and remained at 56% of admissions.



Regions of origin of DRS researchers

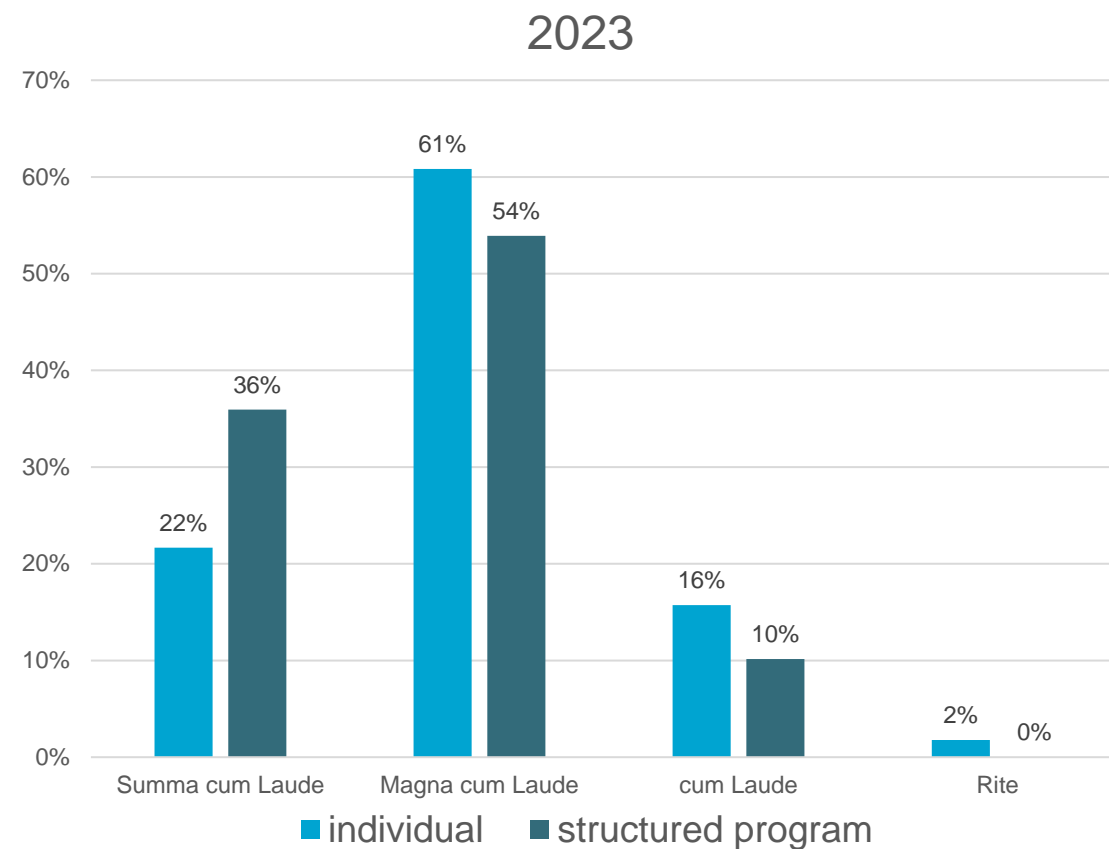
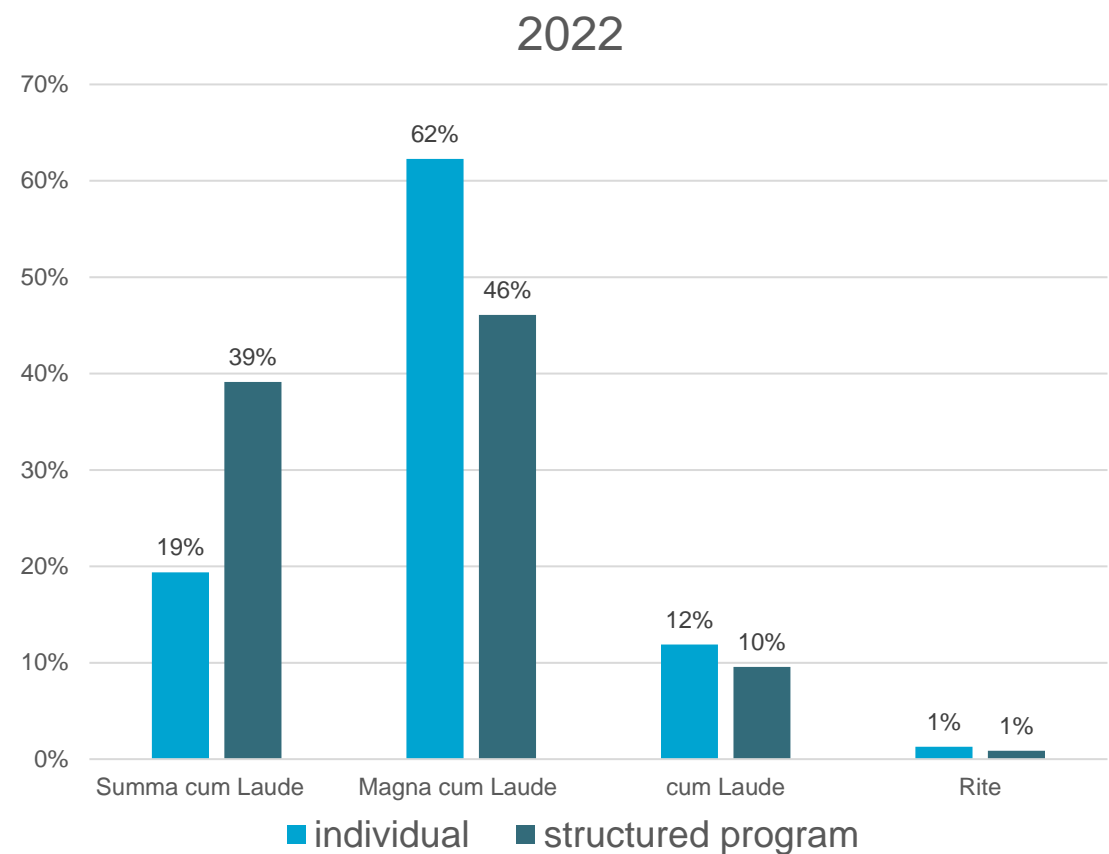


Trend: New admissions/graduations/drop-outs in DRS programs (drop-out ratio 5/100)



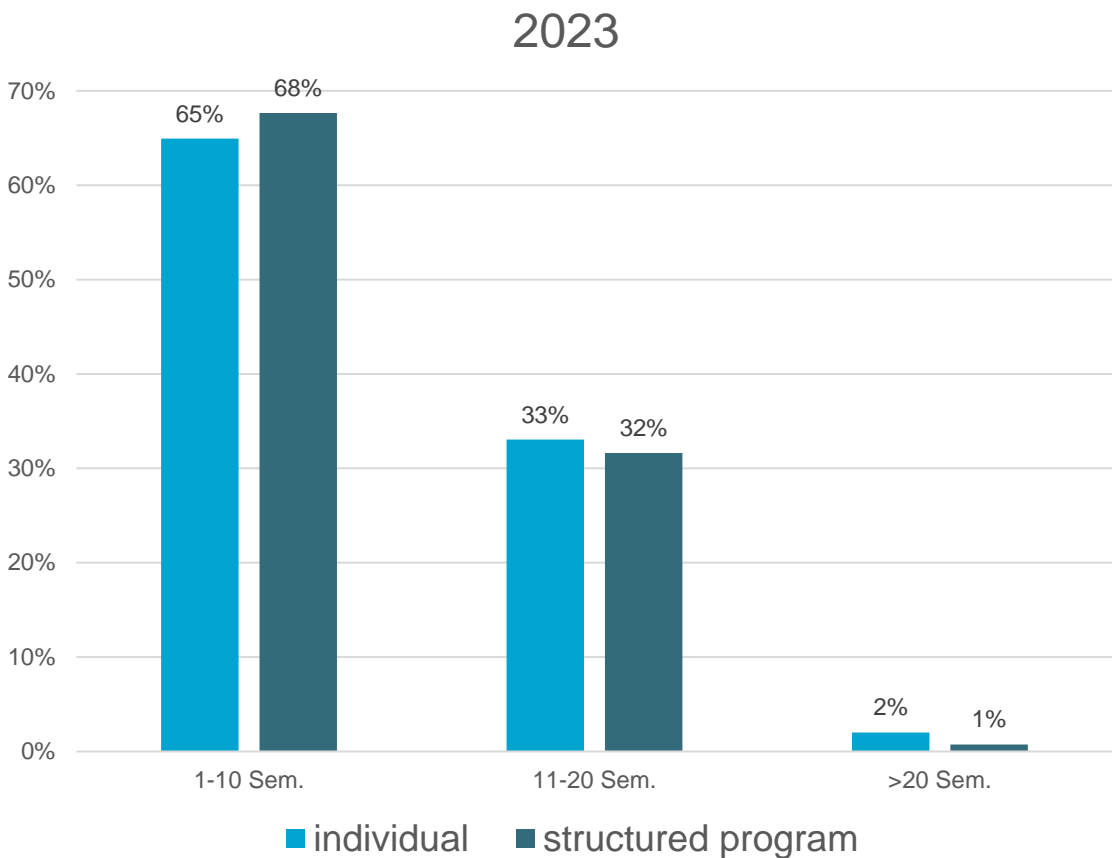
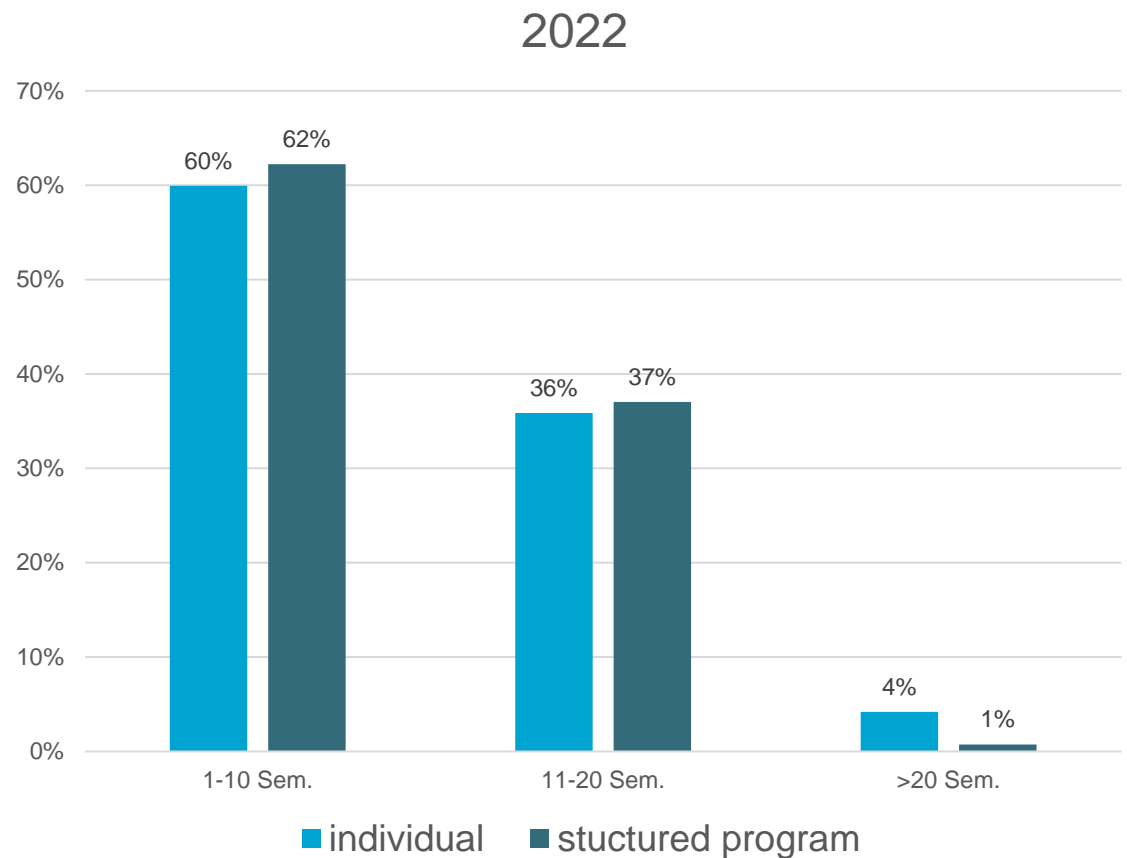

DRS Award for Excellent Supervision

Each year, Dahlem Research School awards two professors from Freie Universität Berlin for outstanding supervision. Doctoral researchers from DRS member programs can nominate their supervisors for the DRS Award for Excellent Supervision.

Nominations are evaluated based on four criteria: supervision of the doctoral thesis, provision of research infrastructure, integration into the scientific community, and career guidance. A selection panel of doctoral researchers and DRS staff reviews the anonymized proposals and selects the awardees. Each award includes a grant of 2,000 Euros to support junior researchers.

Excellence Graduate Schools: Evaluation

In January 2022, the Executive Board appointed a commission of internal and external experts, chaired by Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Hans-Jochen Schiewer, to assess the value of the former Excellence Graduate Schools for Freie Universität and provide funding recommendations.

DRS coordinated the work of the commission, the final report of which was presented in May 2022.

The report showed that the Graduate Schools are outstanding institutions that make the university internationally visible and fulfill the expectation of qualifying exceptional doctoral researchers within an excellent research environment. It recommended that:

- the core funding should be continued with the understanding that the Graduate Schools should

increasingly support themselves by applying for external funding formats.

- the link between Graduate Schools and Clusters of Excellence should be strengthened where possible and appropriate.

The Executive Board decided on this basis to continue funding the Graduate Schools for up to seven years and to re-evaluate after that time.

DISSERTATION PRIZES

ERNST-REUTER-PRIZES FOR OUTSTANDING DISSERTATIONS

The Ernst-Reuter-Prizes, named after the former mayor of Berlin, Ernst Reuter, one of the founders of Freie Universität. The awards, each worth 5,000 euros, are sponsored by the Ernst Reuter Society of Friends, Sponsors, and Alumni of Freie Universität Berlin. The selection process is coordinated by Dahlem Research School.

TIBURTIUS-PRIZES FOR OUTSTANDING FINAL THESES AND DOCTORAL DISSERTATIONS

The Tiburtius-Prize, named after Professor Joachim Tiburtius, the Senator for National Education in Berlin 1951-1963, is awarded annually by the State Conference of Rectors and Presidents of Berlin Universities for outstanding final theses and doctoral dissertations. The Elsa-Neumann-Scholarship provides funding for doctoral researchers at the four Berlin universities.

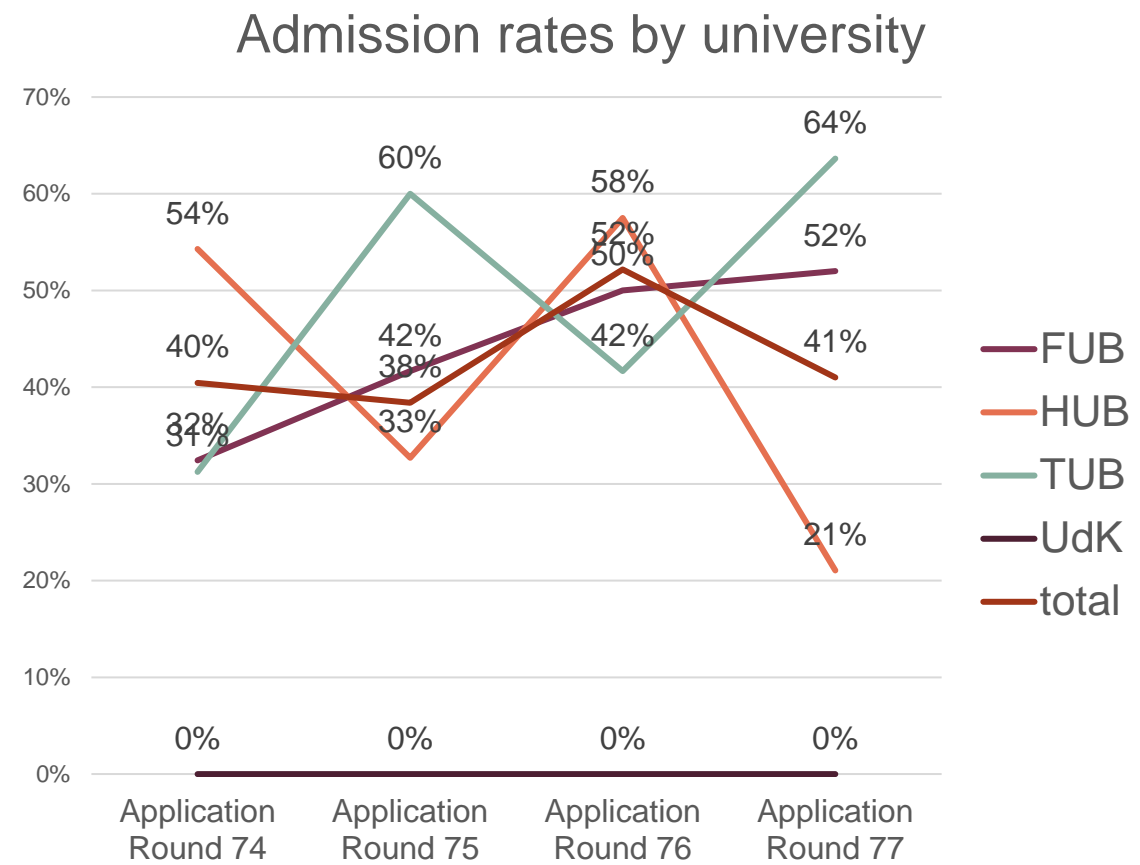
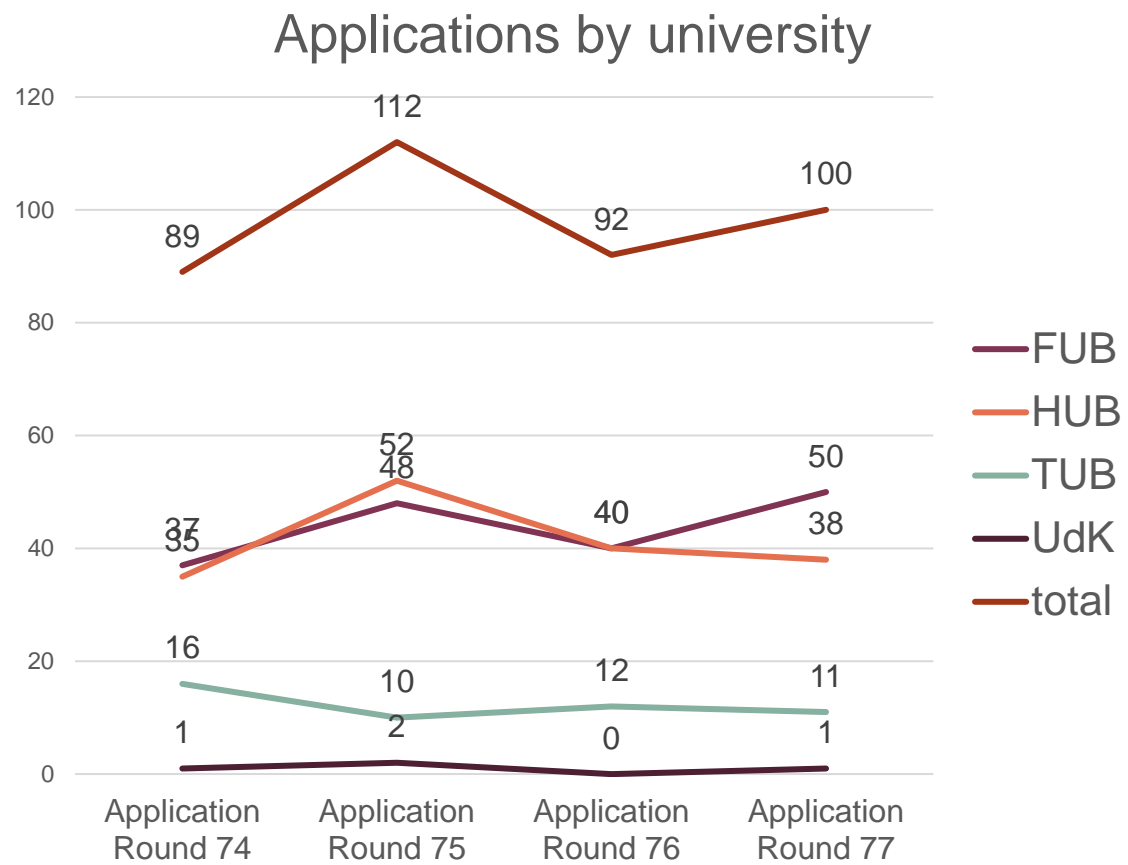
Elsa Neumann was the first woman to receive a doctoral degree from a Berlin University.

To have a chance of success, an applicant's academic performance must be far above average. The doctoral project must make an important contribution to the candidate's field of research.

Scholarship decisions are made by an inter-university Committee for the Allocation of Doctoral Grants whose members are appointed by the Senator responsible for Higher Education in Berlin.

Elsa Neumann Scholarship 2022-2023 (four application rounds)

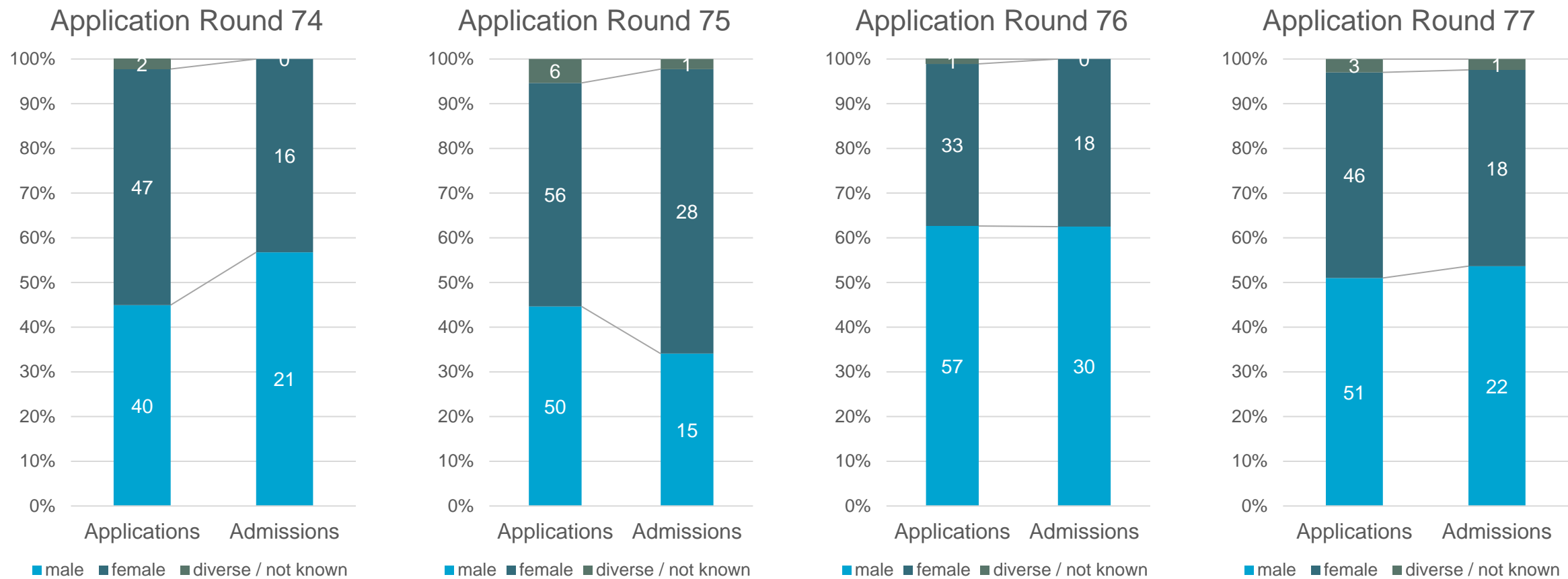

Elsa Neumann Scholarship 2022-2023

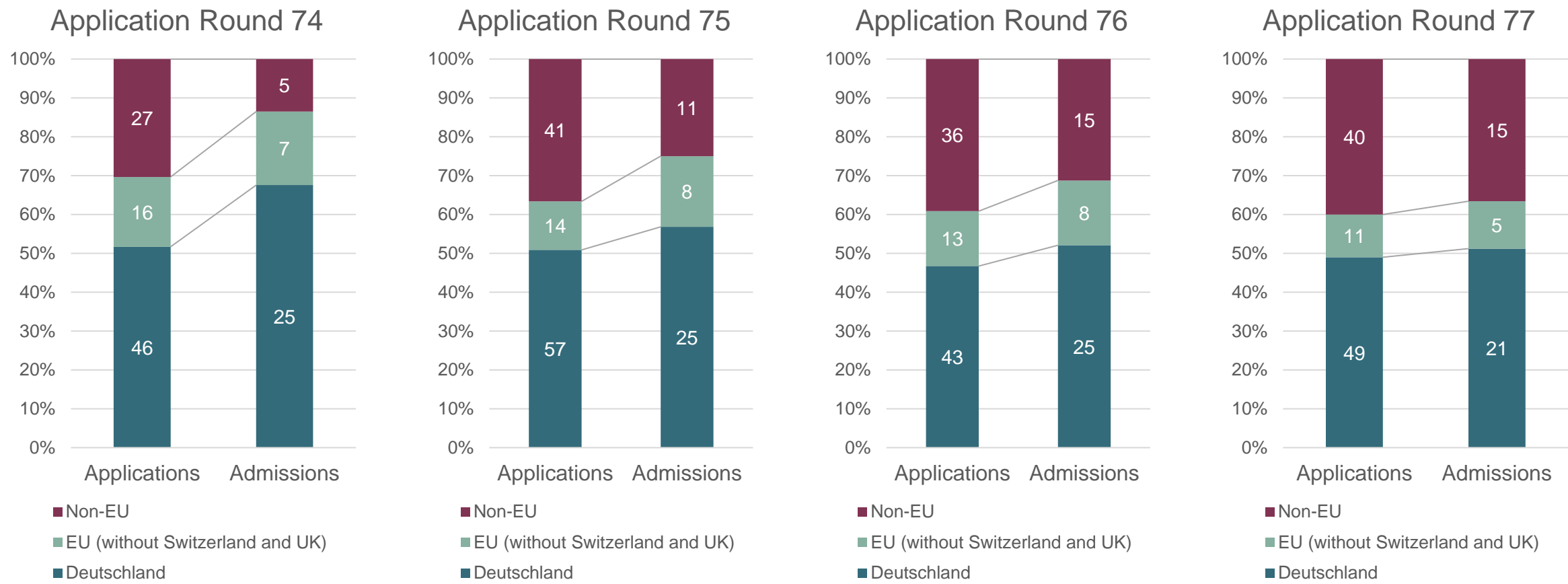
(by gender)

Elsa Neumann Scholarship 2022-2023

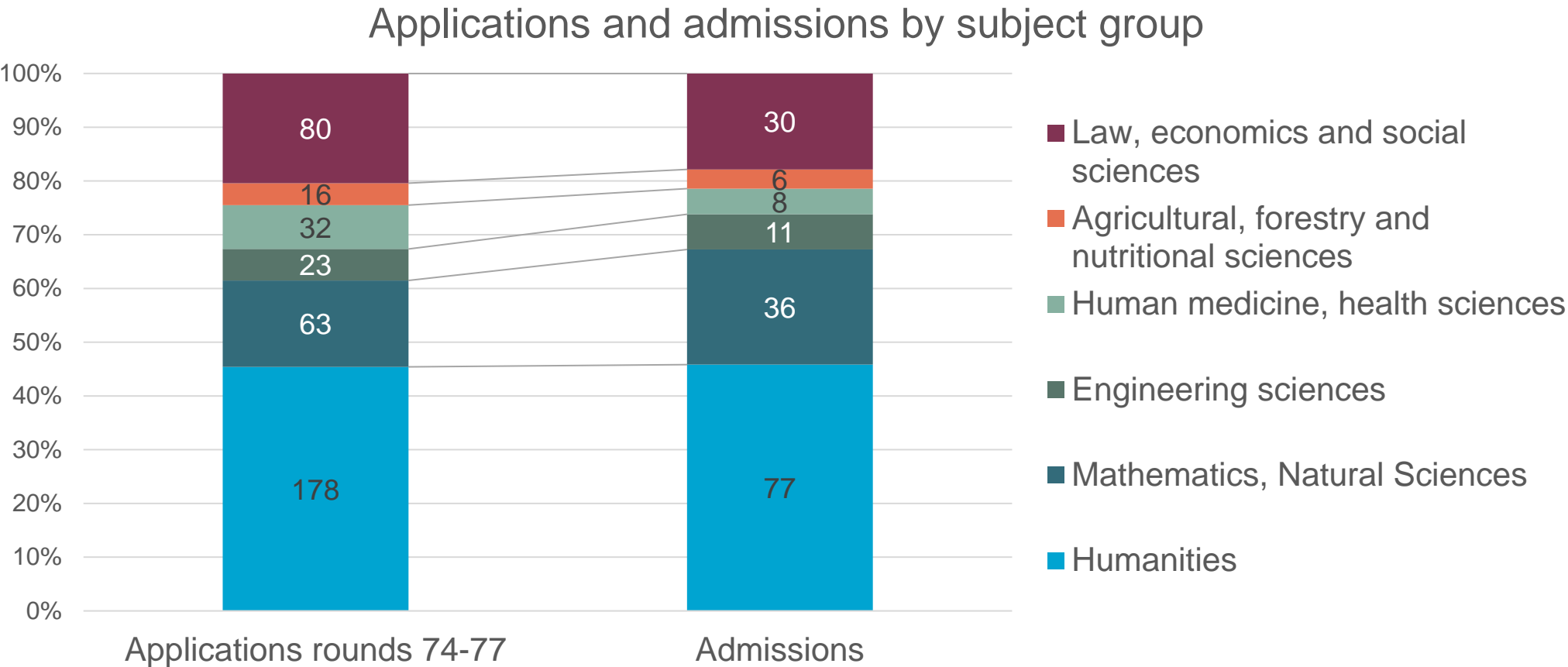
(by nationality)

(by subject group)




NATIONAL ACADEMICS PANEL STUDY

Freie Universität has been part of the National Academic Panel Study (Nacaps) by the German Center for Research on Higher Education and Science (DZHW) since 2018.

Nacaps collects data on the career paths of doctoral and postdoctoral researchers in Germany.

So far, around 40,000 doctoral researchers from 60 universities have participated. Over 40 indicators were collected across seven topics, including employment conditions, doctorate structure, motivation, and career strategies.


In 2023, of 1244 invited doctoral researchers (those enrolled and admitted at Freie Universität between December 2, 2020 and December 1, 2022) 536 participated, a response rate of about 43%.

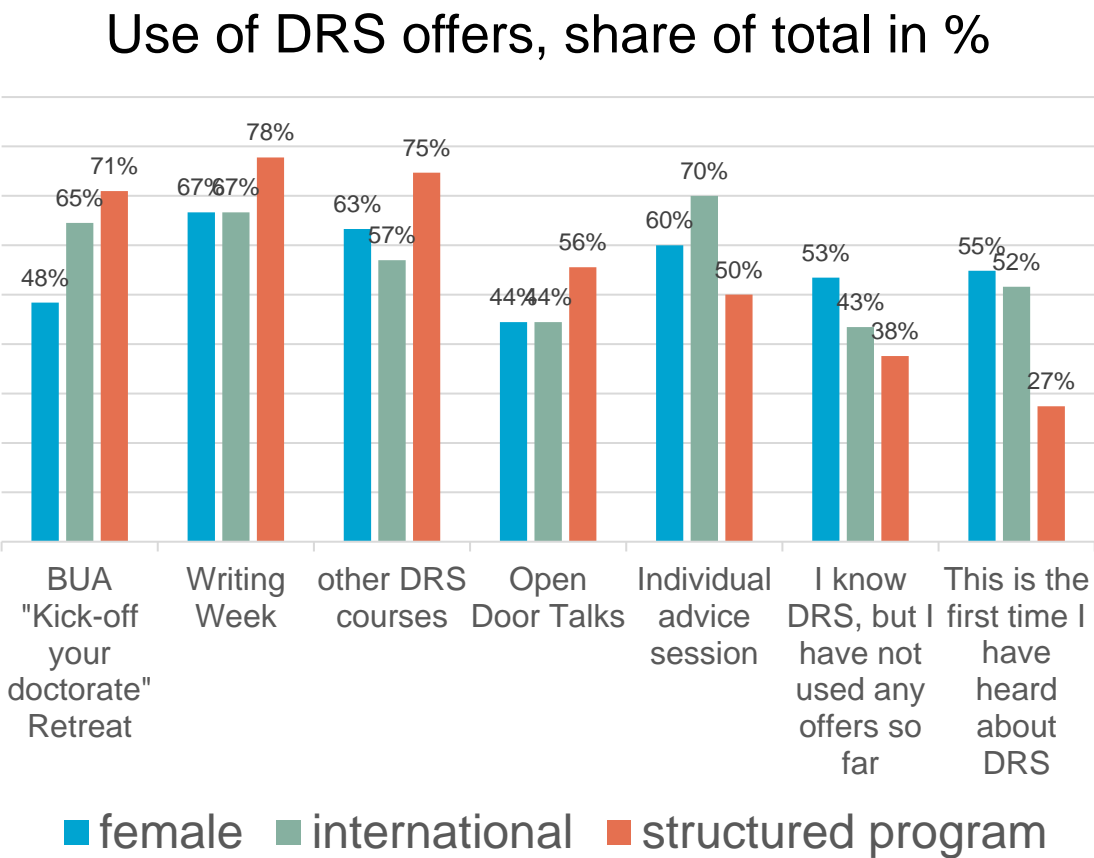
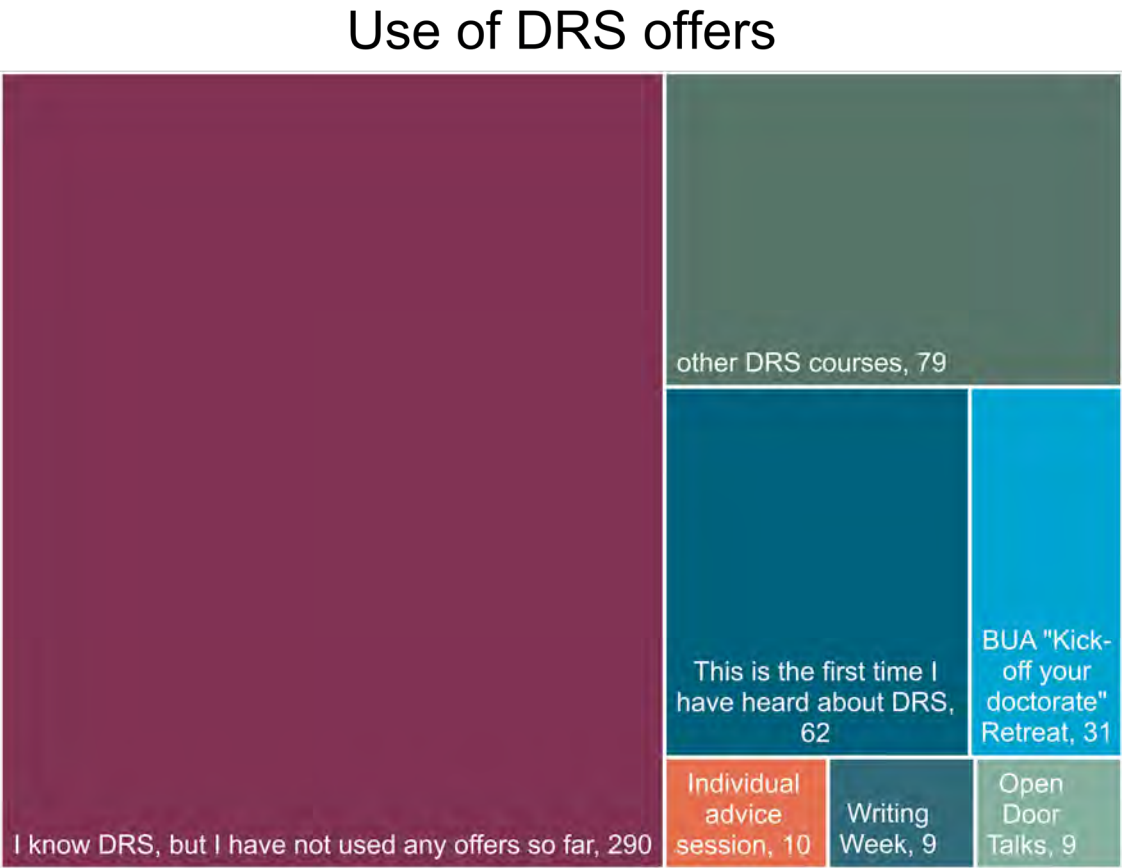
Nacaps Survey 2023 @ Freie Universität Berlin:

courses and lectures for doctoral researchers at own university (n=458)

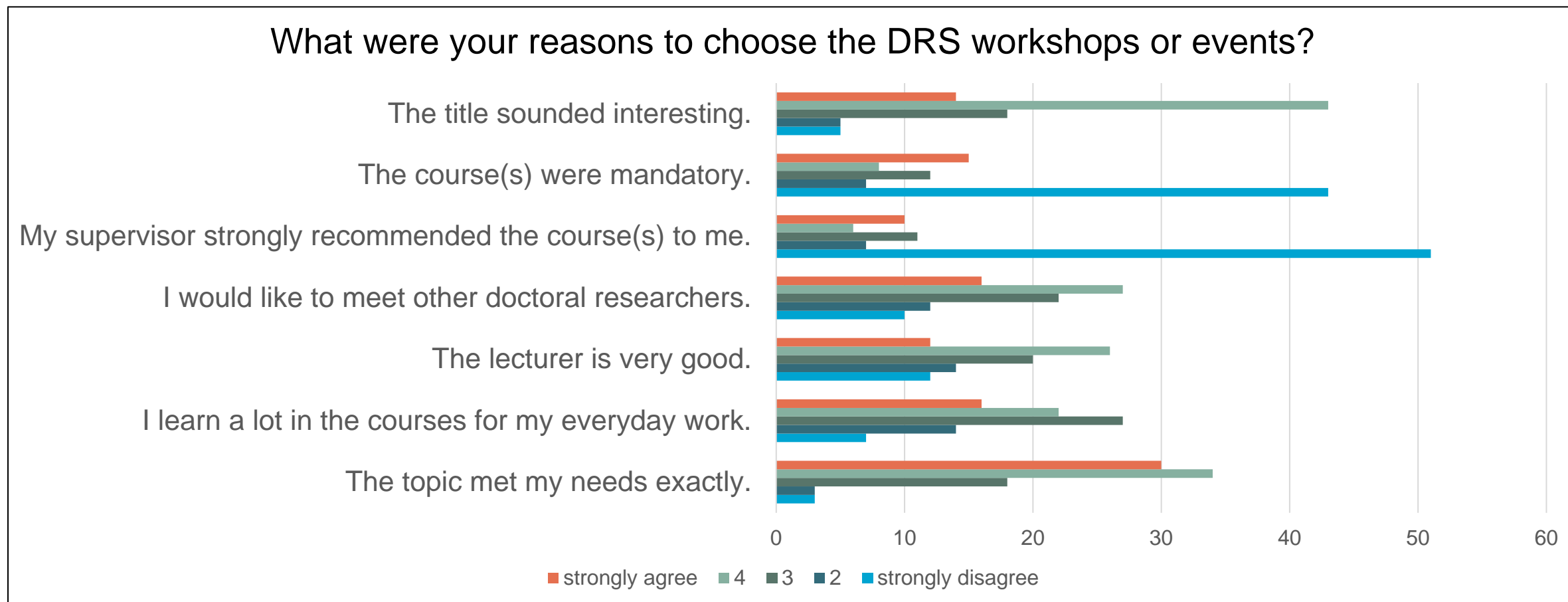

Future Developments

Looking ahead to 2024, we expect the creation of a **Doctoral Council** as stipulated in the amendment of the Berlin Higher Education Act of 2021. After a comprehensive and participatory development process, the Academic Senate of Freie Universität will approve the new Doctoral Council Statutes in early 2024 and the first elections should take place shortly afterwards. DRS will support the preparations for the elections as well as the establishment of and subsequently

the actions of the Doctoral Council. Also coming up in 2024, is the appointment of a **Scientific Advisory Board** for the Dahlem Research School. The Board will consist of three international and three national experts from other research institutions. It will advise on quality standards, the support of researchers in their early qualification and career phase, and make recommendations for the further development of DRS.
